In order to address this need, this local workshop has the goal of providing a forum to foster awareness of what our area colleagues are doing, and giving the attendees a chance to get early feedback from the community on their ongoing work. We also hope that new opportunities for collaboration might be discovered.

The New York Metro Area Networking Workshop will be a one-day meeting with presentations (no full papers) selected from submissions in the form of extended abstracts. Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Internet Services Infrastructure / Content Distribution / WWW
- Wireless / Mobile Networking
- Network Measurement and Characterization
- Multimedia Networking
- Network Control and Architecture

It is expected that submissions will reflect work-in-progress and early ideas, though presentations of more mature work are welcomed.

Submission Guidelines:

Please submit an extended abstract of no more than 5 pages (1.5 spacing, 11pt, incl. figures). All submissions will be electronic, as Postscript or PDF files, as per the instructions posted at <http://domino.watson.ibm.com/confnc/nynet/nynet01/nynet.nsf>.

Submissions will be reviewed by members of the program committee, and accepted presentations will be selected based on interest, novelty, timeliness, and curiosity about the topic.
